

What this means for job seekers



This service will work with you to help you get ready to move into a job. It will also offer opportunities for you to be engaged in local projects in your community if you are unable to work or you're on the pathway to finding a job.

The service will begin on 1 November 2025 and there will be a smooth transition for job seekers who are on CDP.



## What are the benefits of this new service?

It will be more flexible, culturally safe and give you more support. It will:

- Give you training to build your skills to get you ready for work.
- Connect you with local projects that contribute to your community.
- Find jobs that you might want and be ready to move into.
- Give you the opportunity to meet with your provider no matter whether you live in town or further out (e.g. homelands or outstations).
- Give you access to mentoring and other support if required to help improve your well-being.



## What will happen when the new service starts?

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All job seekers will be

transitioned to the new

service. You may have

the same provider or a

new one. The Department

of Employment and

Workplace Relations will

let you know via an SMS.

Your provider will contact you to set up an initial appointment.

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You will meet with the provider, and they will ask you some questions to help develop a new job plan. You will keep meeting
with your provider
every month,
undertake job searches
(if appropriate),
accept paid work

and not leave

suitable paid work.
