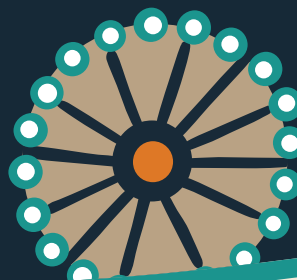

Over \$350 million in additional funding has been committed by the Australian Government to improving the lives of children, young people and families under the Plan for A Better, Safer Future for Central Australia (the Central Australia Plan). These investments run from 2023 through to 2028 and include:

\$91 million

is building better infrastructure for Central Australians



\$50 million

infrastructure in remote communities like playgrounds, sports oval upgrades and laundries



\$10.6 million

for better internet and phone connections



\$4.7 million

for emergency accommodation for women and children



\$18 million

to improve boarding accommodation in Alice Springs



\$5 million

towards the Todd Street Health Hub



\$2.8 million

for CCTV, lighting and safety measures

\$85 million

is providing people with more education and training opportunities



\$4.3 million

for Junior Rangers education programs



\$10 million

to build leadership capacity in communities



\$40.4 million

to support local schools to improve student outcomes



\$30.2 million

for Hubs to deliver jobs training in remote communities

\$50 million

is engaging young people and giving them the support they need



\$27.5 million

for more youth services



\$18.4 million

for health assessments and therapies for young people



\$1 million

for a Youth Services Action Plan



\$3.3 million

for school holiday activities for kids and families

\$116 million

is delivering services to support family and community safety



\$30 million

for projects to prevent family and community violence



\$39.2 million

for safety, domestic violence and community services

for a conflict mediation service

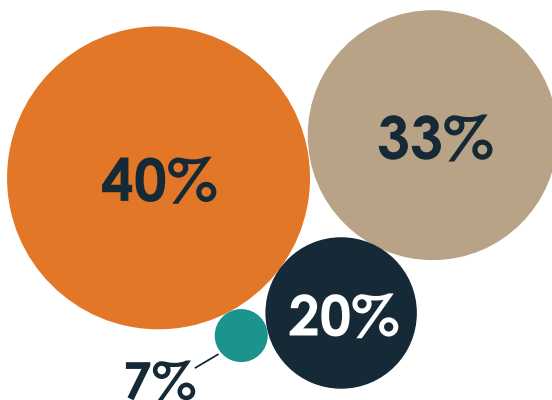
