Traditional owners condemn Warragamba dam wall project.

in the methodology for the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

Of the total land which will be impacted by the dam, only 26% of it has been surveyed for Indigenous cultural artefacts and sites, despite promises and assurances in the methodology for a comprehensive survey. The archaeology methodology for the EIS makes the following promises directly to us:

- To visit dozens of rivers and creeks with high potential for sites.
- to examine our Creation Story, The Journey of Gurangatch and Mirrigan in detail.
- To visit 45 identified locations which relate to significant Waterholes

and other places in the Creation Story, as well as other places of high cultural significance.

Regarding the first point: the whole area is part of a river system in the heart of our Country which was 100% occupied.

Secondly: We don't accept that 26% is a detailed study of the Creation Story when the story covers nearly 100% of the area under threat.

Thirdly, our knowledge is that only 19 of the 45 locations listed have been visited and some of these are incomplete.

These are all promises made to us for the EIS but we are now being told they will not be kept. The government cannot release an EIS which considers the impacts of the project on cultural heritage if they do not survey the entire area that will be destroyed.

We reject and will not consider the finding of the EIS until such time the survey is completed as per the methodology. We feel the 26% surveyed is grossly inadequate and does not represent or do justice to our vast cultural wealth contained within the impact area.

The impact that this proposal will have on our cultural heritage and ability to access significant Ancestral land will be devastating. It will destroy sites which are core to our Gundungurra dreaming story, 'The Journey of Gurangatch and Mirrigan', further shattering the song lines of our people."

Until the dam proposal is scrapped, we will continue to fight for our lands and our culture.

Thank you for your email of 19 August 2019 regarding the proposed raising of the Warragamba dam wall and potential impacts to the Greater Blue Mountains Area.

Following on from my response of 17 July 2019 about the environmental assessment process, Australia's main instrument for protecting world heritage is also through the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*.

Regarding your concerns about potential impacts to the World Heritage listed values of the area, the Australian Government has been assured that any impacts to the Outstanding Universal Value of the Greater Blue Mountains Area will be detailed in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), which would include a cultural heritage assessment component. The EIS would also include avoidance, mitigation and offset measures to reduce, avoid or rectify potential impacts on environmental and heritage values.


I understand the proponent is currently preparing the EIS for this project and this will be released for public consultation later this year.

As required by the World Heritage Committee in its 2019 Decision on the Greater Blue Mountains Area, the Australian Government will prepare an updated report on the state of conservation of the property and will submit this to the World Heritage Centre by 1 December 2020. This report will be examined by the World Heritage Committee at its 45th session meeting in 2021.



Scrap archeology recent reviewed the Aboriginal Heritage Draft report at the invitation of Traditional owners, unfortunately this report missed the submission date and I have been advised to send it to OEH and relevant ministers, s11C and S 47F found that Overall, this report does not meet the requirements of Best Practice Cultural Heritage Management. The survey strategy is flawed. The overall assessment of heritage is too much focused on archaeological sites and pays too little attention to Aboriginal cultural values and the importance of cultural landscapes. The assessment of significance is not adequately explained or justified. The assessment of impact focuses almost entirely on archaeological sites and ignores Aboriginal connections to place and Country. The recommendations do not provide directions to mitigate impact or to manage any places that will be destroyed by impact. There are no recommendations for the protection of sites, heritage places or cultural landscapes that are outside the impact zone and therefore provide opportunities for off-set management planning.

As such we are asking the recommendations of this report be implemented and a second report prepared.

## **No free, prior and informed consent to raise Warragamba Dam wall from Traditional Owners**

Dear Sirs/Madams,

We write to in your capacity as the NSW and Commonwealth Government consent authorities for the proposal to raise the Warragamba Dam wall. We do so after witnessing the gross procedural unfairness afforded to the Puutu Kunti Kurrama and Pinikura peoples in the destruction of the Juukan Gorge Cave in Western Australia.

Gundungarra people and their neighboring peoples across western Sydney have experienced cultural destruction on a landscape scale due to the original construction of Warragamba Dam wall in 1960, which permanently destroyed the vast proportion of Aboriginal cultural heritage in the southern Blue Mountains. We now face the possibility of near obliteration of our cultural heritage from the proposed raising of the Warragamba Dam wall by 17 metres which would flood several hundred remaining burial, cultural and rock art sites.

The Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment completed to date for the dam project has not considered the significant impacts of recent bushfires upon our cultural heritage sites to be flooded, nor have our people been properly engaged in assessing the significance of the cultural heritage areas to be impacted by the dam raising proposal. We have indeed raised serious concerns about the reputation of the NSW Government's chosen consultants to oversee the assessment of the

Warragamba Dam proposal, SMEC Engineering, who have long disregarded Indigenous rights on dam assessments across Asia<sup>1</sup>.

Gundungurra people and their neighboring peoples across western Sydney have not, do not, and will not, provide free, prior and informed consent (FPIC) for the Warragamba Dam wall raising proposal to proceed.

As such, we ask that you do not approve the raising of Warragamba Dam wall. The Commonwealth Government must abide by the World Heritage Convention to protect the Greater Blue Mountains and its rich cultural heritage.

## **Opposition to the Raising Warragamba Dam Wall NSW**

Elevating the Warragamba Dam wall to a height of at least 14 extra metres, and the subsequent capture of more water behind it in Lake Burragorang, is proposed by the NSW Government for flood mitigation and enlarged water storage reasons.

However, raising the Warragamba Dam wall does not guarantee:

- Flood mitigation. As other waters and streams contribute to the flow below the dam in what has always been a natural flood plain.
- To solve the water storage issue. This could and should be addressed by more intentional use of waste water in the Sydney Basin and strategic use of the Sydney Desalination Plant in times of drought.

The raising of the Warragamba Dam wall endangers and destroy even more sacred and historically significant Indigenous sites.

- The likelihood that by the enlargement of the dam would be a serious and deliberate act of disrespect for Aboriginal heritage and its extraordinary value to the culture and life of peoples of NSW.

Gundungurra elder FOI Act s47F wrote

*Our story – the land, people and culture - is at risk again with the proposal to raise the Warragamba Dam wall. We are deeply concerned that this will be the beginning of the end for our culture and history. We have already lost access to so much of our history, much of which we can only read about in books. Reference: Aboriginal Heritage of the Blue Mountains (2019, Edited by Kelvin Knox and Eugene Stockton), page 9.*

- Both the Wollondilly Shire and the Blue Mountains City Councils have indicated in public meetings that the raising of the Warragamba Dam Wall risks breaching Native Title Agreements and compromising Native Title.

The raising of the Warragamba Dam wall threatens the extinction of plants and animals in a National Park.

- The proposal risks the loss of UNESCO World Heritage listing for the Blue Mountains National Park; the extinction of threatened plants and animals, such as the Regent Honeyeater; and the destruction of the last wild rivers in NSW.

I appeal to you as Minister for Indigenous Australians to continue to oppose this proposal to elevate the Warragamba Dam wall and support other investigations and recommendations for alternative action which ensure the preservation of Aboriginal heritage and plant and animal wildlife.

Background

1. On 18 September 2020, **FOI Act s47F** wrote to you about their opposition to the proposed raising of the Warragamba Dam wall (Attachment D).
2. They state the raising of the dam wall will not guarantee flood mitigation or solve water storage problems. Their opposition is based on the potential of the proposal to threaten the destruction of sacred and historically significant Indigenous cultural heritage and the World Heritage values of the Blue Mountains National Park.
3. They also state that both the Wollondilly Shire Council and the Blue Mountains City Council have stated in public meetings that the raising of the dam wall risks breaching Native Title Agreements.

4. The Warragamba Dam wall raising project, a New South Wales (NSW) Government initiative, was assessed under the bilateral agreement between the New South Wales and Commonwealth Governments and was determined as a Controlled Action under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*.
  - a. As a Controlled Action, an Environment Impact Assessment for the project needs to be completed. The NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment is undertaking this assessment.
  - b. The environmental impact assessment is required to identify the impacts of the project, and outline how the project will be assessed and refined to avoid, minimise or offset impacts so that the project, on balance, has the least adverse environmental, social and economic impact, including its cumulative impacts.
  - c. This environmental assessment will include a cultural heritage component, which will consider the impacts on the Outstanding Universal Value of the Greater Blue Mountains Area.
5. The National Indigenous Australians Agency (NIAA) also understands the NSW and Australian Governments are preparing an updated report on the state of conservation of the Greater Blue Mountains Area World Heritage property for submission to the World Heritage Committee by 1 December 2020. This report will be examined by the Committee at its 45<sup>th</sup> session meeting in 2021.
6. An application for protection of the area impacted by the raising of the dam wall, under Section 10 of the *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Heritage Protection Act 1984*, was made in November 2019 by the Gundungurra Aboriginal Heritage Association Inc.
7. The NIAA understands that the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment had sought further information from the applicants and is in the process of briefing Minister Ley.
8. The Minister for the Environment, the Hon Sussan Ley MP, is yet to make a decision on this application. A referral letter to Minister Ley referring this correspondence is at Attachment B.
9. Since the project and the environmental impact assessment are being carried out by the NSW Government, a referral letter to the NSW Minister for Energy and Environment, the Hon Matthew Kean MP is at Attachment C.

### Sensitivity

10. On 28 August 2020, several Gundungurra Traditional Owners wrote to Minister Ley informing her that they had not given Free, Prior and Informed Consent and requesting not to approve the proposal to raise the dam wall. A copy of the letter was sent to you (MC20-004982 refers). Minister Ley is responding to this correspondence.
11. Local governments of the Blue Mountains area have publicly opposed this NSW Government project.







Apologies for the delay - cleared input from DoEE below.

- The proposal to raise the Warragamba Dam wall for flood control purposes has been determined to be a controlled action under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) due to likely significant impacts on World Heritage, National Heritage and listed threatened species and ecological communities.

- The Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) being prepared on the proposal by WaterNSW is expected to be available for public comment in 2019.
- The proposal is being assessed by NSW on behalf of the Australian Government under an assessment bilateral agreement.
- The Australian Government's expectation is that potential impacts on all heritage values relevant to the property, including threatened species and Indigenous cultural values within the proposed inundation area, will be fully addressed in the Environmental Impact Statement.
- A recent New South Wales State Development Committee inquiry into legislation relating to the dam raising recommended 'That the NSW Government ... allow for adequate time to conduct survey mapping for Aboriginal heritage in the impacted areas.' It is expected that this recommendation will be applied in the evaluation process.
- An Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment report will form part of the Environmental Impact Statement.
