



It is the NIAA's view the processes used to assess the applications have satisfied your obligations as the decision maker under the Public Governance, Performance and Accountability Act 2013 and the Commonwealth Grant Rules and Guidelines (CGRGs) (Attachment I). Decisions you make are reviewable under the Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1972.
- 16. Under Section 64(4) of the Land Rights Act, you are the decision maker to approve grant funding from the ABA. You have broadened your delegation of decision-making powers to NIAA Senior Executive Service (SES) employees with responsibilities for ABA matters (Land Rights Act Instrument of Delegation M7 of 2019 executed on 16 October 2019). The conditions you agreed in June 2019 on funding amounts and risk ratings for particular levels of SES delegates apply (MS19-001576 refers) (Attachment I).

As the Minister for Indigenous Australians, I am the final decision maker in relation to any proposal funded from the ABA account for an ABA Beneficial Grant. In the instance of your application, I am pleased to inform you that I have directed the National Indigenous Australians Agency (NIAA) to negotiate funding conditions with Northern Australian Aboriginal Charitable Trust. In making my decision, I took into consideration the assessment undertaken by NIAA and the advice provided by the Aboriginals Benefit Account Advisory Committee.

Please note that this is an in-principle agreement only and the project scope, budget and conditions remain to be agreed. Officials from NIAA will contact you shortly to commence negotiations for your project:

• The Remote Laundries Project - Stage 2.

Once these negotiations have concluded, a delegate may consider entering into a Funding Agreement.

### Attachment I

### **OBLIGATIONS UNDER RELEVANT LEGISLATION**

Under the Aboriginals Benefit Account (ABA) Section 64(4) Beneficial Grant Guidelines, the Minister for Indigenous Australians (the Minister), or Minister's delegate, is the funding approver responsible for deciding grant funding.

On 16 October 2019, the Minister delegated his powers under S64(4) of the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976* to direct amounts to be paid or applied to or for the benefit of Aboriginals living in the Northern Territory to (Instrument Number M7 of 2019):

- the Chief Executive Officer of the National Indigenous Australians Agency (NIAA);
- an SES employee or acting SES employee in the NIAA who is responsible for ABA matters;
- an SES employee or acting SES employee in the NIAA who is classified SES Band 1, or is acting at that level, and is based in the Northern Territory.

On 14 June 2019, the Minister approved the framework under which he agreed that he would delegate certain powers. Under this framework (the Decision Making Policy for Administered Funding), the Minister has delegated authority for administered funding decisions to the NIAA, in regard to ABA Beneficial Grants, as follows:

<sup>\*</sup> These delegations can only be exercised over administered budgets for which the delegate has responsibility.

In making your decision you will need to consider your mandatory obligations associated with approving grants presented by the NIAA.

If you approve expenditure under the Minister's delegation, you *must* ensure that the proposed expenditure is a proper use of money ('proper' when used in relation to the use or management of public resources means efficient, effective, economical and ethical).

When an official is acting under a delegation, it is best practice for officials to include the following information, which an official is required to prepare for a Minister under paragraph 4.6 of the *Commonwealth Grant Rules and Guidelines* (CGRGs):

- 4.6 Officials must provide written advice to Ministers [or delegate], where Ministers [or delegate] exercise the role of an approver. This advice must, at a minimum:
  - a. explicitly state that the spending proposal being considered for approval is a 'grant';
  - b. provide information on the applicable requirements of the PGPA Act and rules and the CGRGs (particularly any ministerial reporting obligations), including the legal authority for the grant;
  - c. outline the application and selection process, including the selection criteria, that were used to select potential grant recipients; and
  - *d.* include the merits of the proposed grant or grants relative to the grant guidelines<sup>1</sup> and the key consideration of achieving value with relevant money. <sup>2</sup>

If the proposed expenditure of relevant money relates to a grant, paragraph 4.5 of the CGRGs requires where you exercise the role of approver you *must* also record, in writing, the basis for the approval relative to the grant guidelines and key considerations of value with relevant money. The recommended basis and record for the approval, relative to the grant guidelines and the key consideration of value for money, are set out in this brief. If there is any alternative basis or considerations on which you are basing your decision you should record these in accordance with clause 3.9 of the CGRGs.

If you approve the commitment of relevant money under s23(3) of the *Public Governance*, *Performance and Accountability Act 2013* (PGPA Act) an NIAA officer will enter into the arrangement pursuant to s23(1) of the PGPA Act, or s32B of the FF(SP) Act (and 32C if applicable).

The NIAA is responsible to ensure forward year commitments are recorded in accordance with the PGPA Act. The NIAA must record any applicable amounts if you approve the grants recommended in this brief.

### Conflict of interest

If you as a delegate, in making this decision, have a real or perceived conflict of interest, you will need to make an appropriate declaration and consider any further steps you may need to take to address the conflict. This could include referring this decision to an alternate delegate. Further information including your obligations, can be found in the <u>Conflict of Interest Policy</u> on the intranet.

<sup>1</sup> This includes the requirement that a proposed grant be consistent with the policies of the Commonwealth, noting that these policies include the guidelines issued in respect to the relevant granting activity. In this context, the basis for recommending or rejecting each proposed grant should be set out in the assessment material for each grant and should reflect the particular merits of each project in terms of the grant guidelines (including assessment against the eligibility and assessment criteria)



I advised \$47F the February 2020 outcomes were known for the majority of the applications and there were 11 the Minister was seeking further information on before making his final decision and that an outcome should be known in the next 6-8 weeks. \$47F asked what further information the Minister wanted and when he would be briefed. I advised \$47F the information would come from internal and the Minister would be briefed in the next 1-2 weeks. \$47F voiced her concern at it taking so long to receive an outcome on their application (now over 12 months ago). I also let \$47F know that we would let them know via email of the outcome as soon as we receive it.

called again this morning and mentioned the Governor General met with them last Friday and was supportive of the project and wrote to the Minister for Health on Saturday. 47F also mentioned they had received a report from on the benefits of the project and highlighted a finding in the report that the project would see a savings to government of \$78m through the project of establishing seven more laundries over the next five years.

asked for an update on the outcome, again expressing her concern in the delay of getting an outcome on the application. S47F asked if there was a way to escalate the decision making so they were able to plan for the project outlining the health benefits and employment benefits of the project. I advised S47F we could not single out their application above all others and that we would need to brief the Minister on all 11 applications at the same time. S47F asked for a timeframe of when the outcome would be known as she did not feel the 6-8 week timeframe was soon enough and has asked for us to get back to her with a solid timeframe and not the 6-8 week guestimate.

Please advise who will call her back to provide the solid timeframe.





The Aboriginals Benefit Account Advisory Committee (ABAAC) met in Darwin on 15 to 18 March 2021 to consider and make recommendations on \$22(grant applications received in the August 2020 Aboriginals Benefit Account (ABA) funding round and the final 2 proposals for the ABA Homelands Project. One application was subsequently withdrawn, leaving 122 beneficial grant applications for your consideration.

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## Background

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12. It is the NIAA's view the processes used to assess the applications have satisfied your obligations as the decision maker under the *Public Governance*, *Performance and Accountability Act 2013* and the *Commonwealth Grant Rules and Guidelines* (CGRGs). Decisions you make are reviewable under the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1972*. The assessment process is described at (<u>Attachment G</u>).

- 13. Under Section 64(4) of the Land Rights Act, you are the decision maker to approve grant funding from the ABA. You have broadened your delegation of decision-making powers to NIAA Senior Executive Service (SES) employees with responsibilities for ABA matters (Land Rights Act Instrument of Delegation M7 of 2019 executed on 16 October 2019). The conditions you agreed in June 2019 on funding amounts and risk ratings for particular levels of SES delegates apply (MS19-001576 refers) (Attachment H).
- 14. Once the NIAA has negotiated conditions with relevant organisations, a NIAA delegate will take into review the merits of the proposal, the organisation's risk rating and the parameters of the project when considering making a direction to debit under Section 64(4) of the Land Rights Act.



## ABA GRANT FUNDING ROUND **AUGUST 2020**



As per the ABA Grant Guidelines, funding was available for either small projects up to and including \$250,000, or large projects valued over \$250,000, under four funding categories:

- Supporting Enterprises;
- Supporting Community;
- Supporting Culture, Language and Leadership; and
- Supporting Land, Sea and Waters Management and Use.

#### Assessment of Applications

The objective of the assessment process is to identify projects to be recommended for the negotiation of funding conditions including recommending the amount of funding to be negotiated.

A Grant Design Strategy was developed to support the Agency's assessment of the applications, in line with the ABA Grant Guidelines and the Commonwealth Grants Rules and Guidelines. The Strategy sets out the approach for assessment of applications to ensure it is robust, transparent, and fair. The Strategy provides details on the following process:

- The Assessment Management Office undertook the registration compliance check of applications received before they were distributed to Agency staff for assessment.
- Each application was assessed by one Agency Panel Member sourced from the relevant Region. These staff were provided with appropriate tools and training to support them through the assessment process.
- The Regional Managers of each Northern Territory Region provided advice on whether each application was endorsed.

• A review process was conducted to ensure the consistency and quality of advice provided to the ABAAC.
